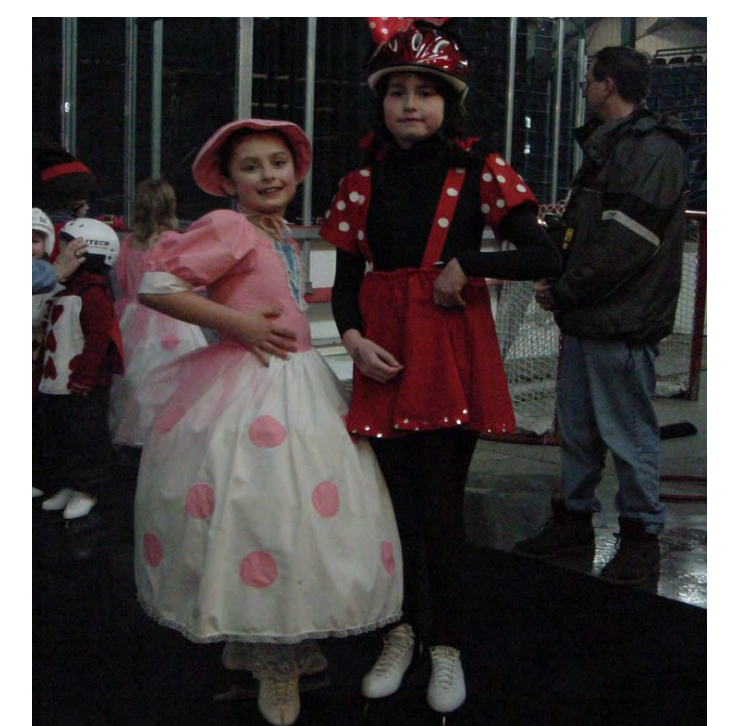

When asked, community members say the major issues are...

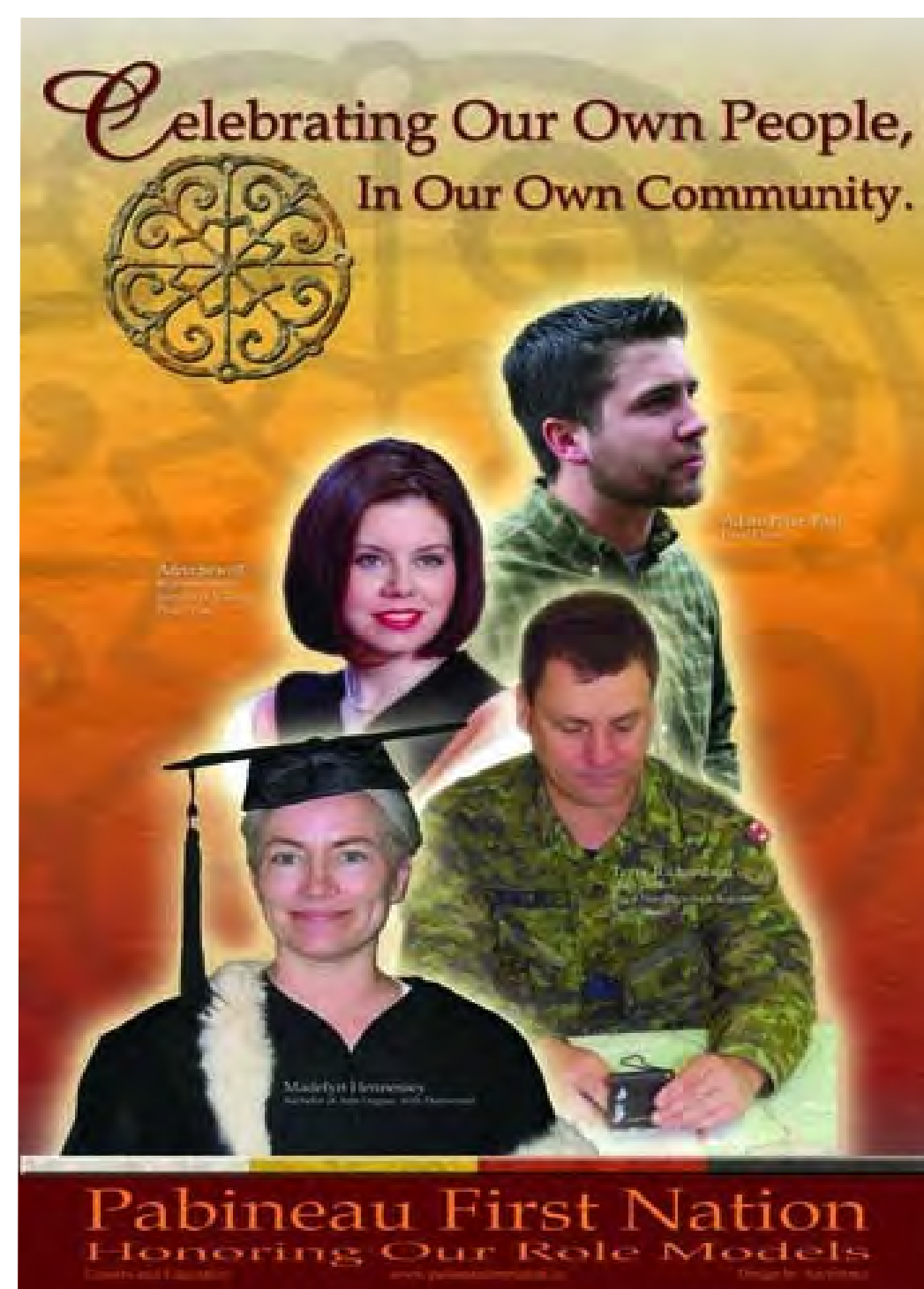
- Burning down houses

When asked, community members say the major strengths are...

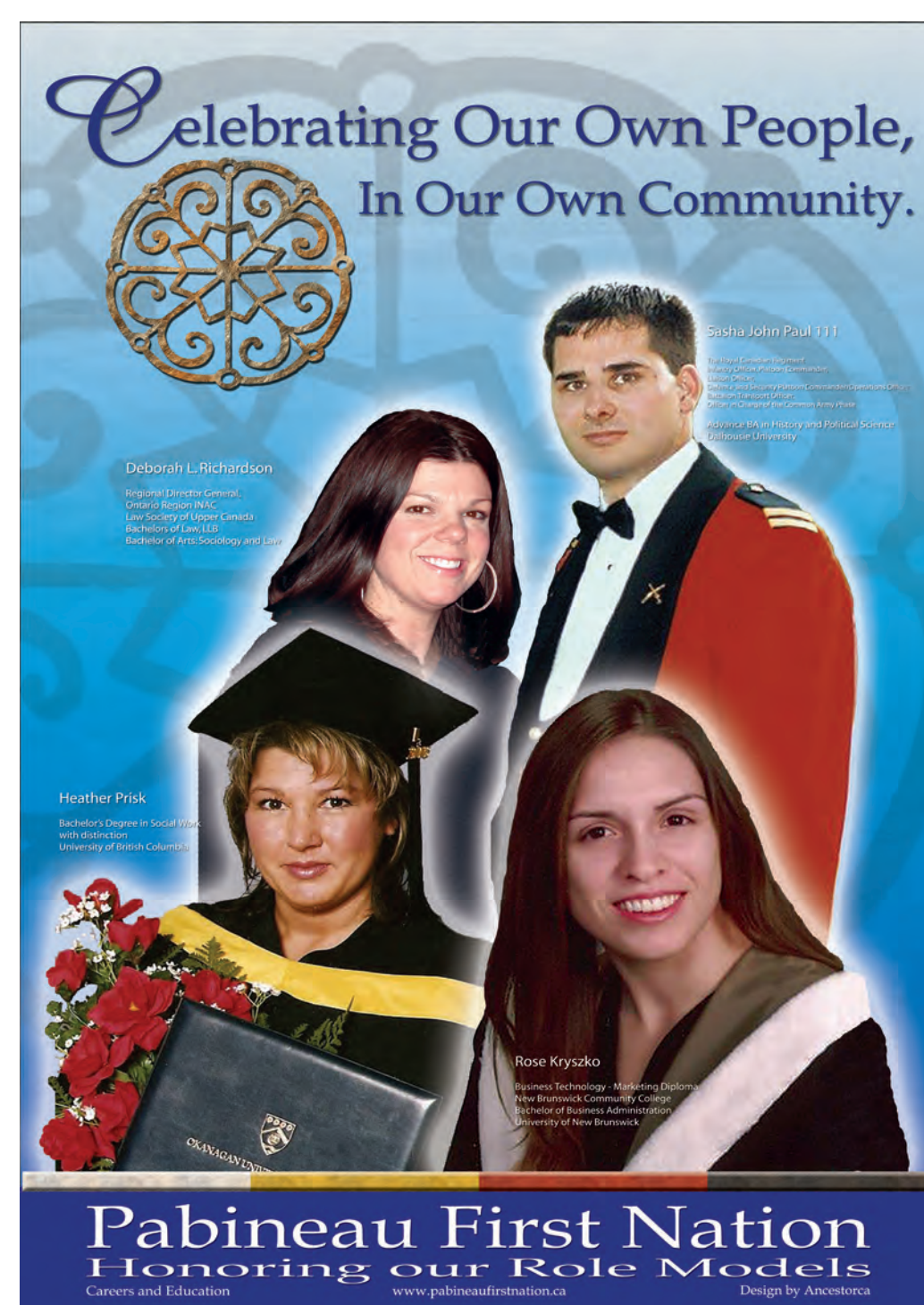
- Many are working towards the advancement of the community as a whole
